

Succeeding in an 8-Week Course: A Student Success Guide

What Makes an 8-Week Course Different?



An 8-week course covers the same content as a traditional 16-week course—but in half the time. This means:

- Twice the pace of learning
- More frequent deadlines
- Less time to catch up if you fall behind

Think of it as a **focused, fast-moving experience** that requires consistent engagement from day one.

What Does This Mean for You as a Student?

Success in an 8-week course is less about “working harder” and more about working consistently and intentionally.

You should expect to:

- Log in to your course **4–6 days per week**
 - Spend **15–25 hours per week** on coursework (per class)
 - Stay actively engaged in discussions, assignments, and readings

Top Strategies for Success

1. Start Strong on Day One



- Review the syllabus immediately
- Note all due dates in a planner or digital calendar
- Complete early assignments as soon as possible

💡 *Tip: Falling behind early in an 8-week course is very difficult to recover from.*

2. Plan Your Week (Every Week)

- Break assignments into smaller daily tasks
- Schedule dedicated study time just like a class meeting
- Avoid waiting until the last minute because deadlines come quickly

💡 *Successful students treat 8-week courses like a structured routine, not flexible time.*

3. Engage Actively, Not Passively



- Participate in discussions early in the week
- Take notes while reading or watching lectures

- Ask questions when something is unclear

💡 *Engagement = understanding. Passive reading is not enough in a fast-paced course.*

4. Stay Ahead (Not Just Caught Up)

- Aim to be **1–2 days ahead** of deadlines when possible
- Complete readings before assignments are due
- Begin larger projects early

💡 *In an 8-week course, “caught up” can quickly become “behind.”*

5. Use Available Support

- Instructor office hours
- Tutoring or writing centers
- Student Success Center resources

💡 *Asking for help early is a strength, not a weakness.*

6. Manage Your Time Realistically



- Be honest about your work, family, and personal commitments
- Limit distractions during study time
- Break large tasks into manageable pieces

💡 *Time management is the #1 predictor of success in accelerated courses.*

Common Challenges (and How to Overcome Them)

Challenge	Solution
Falling behind early	Start assignments immediately and communicate with your instructor
Feeling overwhelmed	Break tasks into daily goals
Procrastination	Use scheduled study blocks and set reminders
Not understanding content	Ask questions early—don't wait

A Simple Weekly Plan Example

Monday–Tuesday:

- Review materials, start readings, begin discussion posts

Wednesday–Thursday:

- Continue coursework, respond to peers, work on assignments

Friday–Saturday:

- Finalize and submit assignments

Sunday:

- Review feedback and prepare for the next week
